

Wadawanuk Club 420 and International 420 Regatta

Notice of Race July 29, 2017

Rules: This regatta will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017- 2020*, unless modified by the US Sailing prescriptions and the rules of USODA, or unless modified by these instructions. The 720 rule is in effect.

Changes to the NOR: The race committee reserves the right to make written changes to this document, either written in the sailing instructions, or verbally at the skippers meeting. The Sailing Instructions will be posted online starting July 12th

Registration

Boats shall register online prior to July 17th. Boats failing to register by this date will be subject to a \$15 late fee. The fee for registration is \$45

Safety: Lifejackets must be worn at all times on the water and docks.

If any competitor chooses to leave the racecourse before the end of racing, they must notify the race committee or a support boat.

When entering and exiting the Harbor, please keep clear of all traffic (commercial vessels have the right of way).

Schedule of Races:

0830 – 0930	Registration
0930	Competitor's Meeting
0945	Harbor Start
1030	First race (one race shall constitute a regatta, low point scoring will be used, a throw out race will be given if six or more races are sailed)
12-1230 ish	Short break for self-provided lunch.
1500	No race will be started after this time. Awards to follow.

Fleets: Club 420 Sailors will be divided into Red, Blue and White fleets by their age on the day of the regatta. Red, White and Blue fleets will start together at the mouth of West Harbor. International 420 start will be same course but with separate start following Club 420.

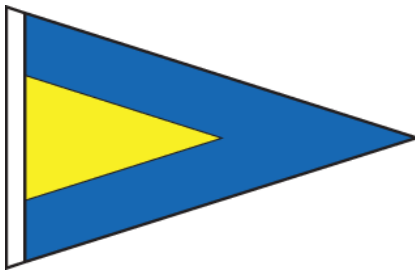
Courses: Courses will be a single or double Modified Triangle (T), or a Modified Windward Leeward (W) with a gate. The course will be specified on a dry erase board on the race committee boat prior to the start. Marks on the Red White and Blue fleet will be orange balls.

Starts: On the Red, White, Blue and I420 racecourse, the 5 minute start sequence will be used in accordance with the RRS. The start will be between an orange flag on the committee boat and a yellow cylinder.

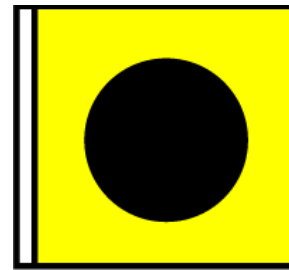
Recalls: Individual recalls will be signaled by the use of the code flag X. The committee boat will make every attempt to hail the sail numbers of boats over early. Failure to hear sail numbers and clear oneself will not be grounds for redress. General recalls will be signaled with multiple whistle blasts and the First Substitute flag, followed by the institution of Rule 30.1 (Round an End) accompanied by code flag I.

Protests: Protest flags are not required. Any sailor wishing to protest must inform the committee boat of his or her intent upon finishing. Protest forms must be completed and turned in 30 minutes after the RC has docked.

Spectators: Spectators are requested to stay clear of the racing area so as not to interfere with the race. Coaching during the race is only allowed on the Green Fleet racecourse for the bottom 50% of the fleet.

Lunches and Water: Lunches will not be provided on the water. Competitors are responsible for bringing their own food and water to the regatta. The race committee and support boats will have jugs of water to refill sailor's water bottles.
